Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it. - Proverbs 22:6 -

These words from the Book of Proverbs goes a long way to explain a key role of every congregation - to raise up the next generation in faith so that they can one day assume the mantle of leadership for the church that it may continue in it's Christian mission. We are just starting our 2022 Confirmation Class as I write this and I am very excited about our four candidates, Dilan Finke, Shelby Moreno, Mitchell Schlabach, and Brooklin Stolz and their journey of faith as we begin. Confirmation is a big commitment for not just the candidates and their parents, but also the church.

"It Takes a Village to Raise a Child" - traditional African proverb Indeed, it is the congregation's investment into the young lives which will make the difference in their spiritual journey toward their confirmation. It's more than what the pastor imparts through his teaching in class; it's really about how the candidates feel about the church they are joining. Do they truly feel a part of the church or is confirmation just another part of the childhood journey toward adulthood to be obtained like a high school diploma or driver's license? Is it just Wreaths Across America another certificate to accumulate and hang on the wall?

> I ask this question because it's pretty common knowledge that we have a pretty low "post-confirmation retention rate" in our church. What can we do to change that tread? Well, as it turns out I recently viewed an EA (Evangelical Association) pastor's forum on how churches achieve successful confirmations with high retention rates after the event. But the solutions offered require more than just the pastor's input into the young lives of the candidates - it requires the effort of every member of the congregation. Just as the proverb says, "It takes a village to raise a child," so it takes the whole church to invest in the spiritual journey and ultimate retention of a confirmand. Likewise, we should be willing to openly share or faith with them. We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done. - Psalm 78:4 -

> This year candidates will be required to find a mentor to help them toward their goal toward confirmation; would you be willing to serve in that capacity for one of young people? If not, what would you be willing to do to help? Remember, it takes a village to raise a child, and it takes a congregation to raise up a child in the way that they should go in following the Lord. Please be prayerful about what you can do to help with this year's class and let me know what gifts you have to lend to that effort. Together, we can make a big difference in our young people's lives.

REMINDER: Another option for providing your offerings to Friedens!

We now have a way to give using your phone, tablet, or the website for those people who don't like to write checks, and for members who live out of town and want a convenient way to give. You can still write checks or give cash; this will be convenient for those who do everything online. You will still be able to

designate where your money goes, ie. Offering, Repair fund, Disaster Relief, etc.

The app is called Tithe.ly and you can give using credit card, debit card or direct ACH withdrawal. There is a modest processing charge associated with the online giving. You will have the option to have the fee taken out of your donation, or adding the fee to your donation. The fee structure is: 2.9% + \$0.30 per Transaction Credit or Debit Card

> 1% + \$0.30 per Transaction for ACH direct transfer 3.05% + \$0.30 per Transaction American Express Cards

To use this service:

- 1. You can log on to the church website at www.friedens.com, look for the Giving button (at the bottom of the homepage) and click there. You will be asked for your name, email and phone number the first time that you give. You can log on each time that you want to give, or you can set up a recurring gift so that you don't have to log on each time.
- 2. Also, You can go to the Apple app store or Google Play app store and download the **Tithley** app (Not the Tithely Pay app*). The Logo is a green leaf (see above) the first time, you will need to set up your account information and search for Friedens Church of Washington, TX. You will also have to set a pin number.

^{*}The Tithely Pay app is for churches that sell things such as a bake sale and want to be able to take credit card payments. This will not work for tithing.

Dear Members of Friedens Church,

2nd Reminder

Once again Friedens Church finds itself at a crossroads. We have an important decision to make together as a congregation. The climate in today's society is different from when most of us were growing up, and certainly very, different from when Friedens Church was founded some 130 years ago. As a result, the denomination, UCC, to which our church belongs, has attempted to change with the times. The UCC seems to be pulling away from the teachings of the Bible in favor of society's current trends.

As a result, many in our congregation are questioning our continued membership in the UCC. Since we no longer donate financially to the UCC, and they have not interfered with the daily operation of our church other members feel our church should remain in the UCC.

However, you must look at the bigger picture. How do the policies of the UCC affect Friedens Church? True the UCC is not interfering with our church operations. But our membership in the UCC is affecting potential growth and membership. There have been several families that considered becoming members until they checked into the UCC and found what they stand for and what they promote.

Many of us remember and fear a repeat of the divide that occurred in Friedens Church several years back, and understandably so. However, of greater concern is do the policies and practices of the UCC represent the teachings of the Bible, and do we as a Church, and a Child of God want to be a part of that organization.

On Sunday, May 23, 2021, at our congregational meeting a motion was made, seconded, and passed by a majority with one opposing, to take a vote in October to either leave or maintain Friedens Church membership in the UCC. <u>That vote will be taken on Sunday,</u> <u>October 17, 2021, at congregational meeting directly after church.</u> I want every member to understand that we need two thirds of the congregation (approximately 195 members) in attendance at this meeting in order to take a vote.

Before you make your decision, I urge you to search the UCC website at www.ucc.org (see below QR scan) to familiarize yourself with the policies and practices of the UCC. If you have a friend or family member that does not have access to the internet, please share with them the information you find.

In closing I would like to encourage all you, both our senior citizens and our young families to please put this important congregational meeting in October on your calendars. This decision needs to be determined by the majority of our members, so we hope you will take a look at the UCC website and join us in October to cast your vote.
