A congregational meeting will be called on Sunday, October 16, 2022 for the purpose of voting on changing the number required to constitute a quorum to affect changes in our constitution. The vote would allow changing Section 3, paragraph A from two-thirds to one-third of the congregation voting members at a regularly called meeting to constitute a quorum.

FRIEDENS CHURCH OF WASHINGTON, UCC CONSTITUTION ARTICLE II.

### Section 3. Affiliation

(A) This congregation is and shall be a member of the South Central Conference of the United Church of Christ until two-thirds (one-third) of the congregation voting members at a regularly called meeting vote for its withdrawal from same. Any questions concerning this proposed change can be addressed to any member of council or the pastor.

A catered meal for all will follow in the Activities Center. Then, activities for both adult and children will be available for family fun. As mentioned in the last newsletter, a call committee has been formed to contact members on the above issue and encourage participation at the October meeting. You should expect to be contacted or you may contact any committee member directly with your input or any questions you may have. Committee members are listed below.

## **Seasonal Missions of Women's Fellowship**

The Women's Fellowship is still collecting school and hygiene supplies. The school supplies will be delivered to local schools later when these items will be needed to complete the school year. Hygiene supplies will be delivered to the local nursing homes or the Senior Center in Brenham. The boxes are in the narthex.

We also voted to start collecting items to be delivered to the local nursing homes for bingo prizes. Items that are being collected include: snacks, (prepackaged crackers, puddings, popcorn, goldfish, pretzels), drinks, (flavored water, diet drinks, Gatorade); coloring books, word find books, notepads, magazines, color pencils, markers, etc. and miscellaneous items such as purses, wallets, scarves, and costume jewelry. We will be sponsoring the Christmas Ornament Exchange Program for the Brenham State Supported Living Center again this year. ## Spotlight on Washington Volunteer Fire Department

During the Remembrance Service on September 11th of those fallen first responders at the Twin Towers 21 years ago our local first responders were also recognized for 50 years of service to the Washington community at Friedens Church. Just as when the fire department first started in 1972, all are members of our church and have served since a few of them stood on the roof to try and quench the flames that eventually claimed our old church that same year. Additionally, the Navasota Fire Department protected our parsonage from being consumed in that blaze 50 years ago and they were also represented by a fire truck and personnel for this event.

The ties between the church and the Washington Volunteer Fire Department continue today right down to the pastors - just as Rev. D. L. R. McDougle was a charter member in 1972 our current pastor serves as a firefighter with the department today. The efforts of extraordinary leadership through the years has produced a Fire Department, grown from the humble beginnings of Station No. 1 erected across the street from the church in 1976, to a state-of-the-art facility on SH 105 (Station No. 2) which also houses District 5 EMS personnel and our county EMS helicopter.

Recognized for 50 years of faithful service include: Chief Clyde Miller, President Don Hinze, Capt. Robert Jensen, Firefighter Billy Ray Jensen, and auxiliary members Kitty Miller and Linda Oberhoff. Thank you each and every one for your dedicated service. May the Lord continue to bless you and keep you safe as you continue to work protecting our community.
