Are We in the New Great Awakening? by Susan Holle

There have been four Great Awakenings in American history: 1730–1755, 1790-1840, 1855-1930, and 1960-1980. They started when our nation faced a decline in faith, and Americans were looking for something to fill the void in their lives. During those periods, millions found God and accepted Jesus as their Savior. Now more even ever, we need another Great Awakening, but maybe we're at the beginning of one.

On February 8th, the students at Asbury University, a private Christian university in Wilmore, Kentucky, went to the chapel for a worship service as usual, but it didn't stop until February 24th 2023. Thanks to social media, the worship service grew into a revival. At first, the town's people came, then across the state. In the following days and weeks, people from all over the country and other countries flocked to the small university. It had gotten so overwhelming that the university leaders ended the round-the-clock service on February 24th.

By its end, the revival brought 50,000-70,000 visitors to Asbury. However, similar prayer services have been held at other colleges, including Samford University in Alabama, Lee University in Tennessee, and Baylor University and Texas A&M University in Texas.

It's funny that on the last day of the Asbury revival, the Jesus Revolution movie was released in theaters. Pastor Greg Laurie, whose story is in the film, said, "The timing couldn't be more perfect. It really seems to me like God is at work." Just as in the last Great Awakening (The Jesus Movement) in the 60s and 70s, Americans, especially the younger generations, are living in dark and scary times. They're dealing with political and racial division and worrying about nuclear war. Young adults and kids now, as the hippies back then, are searching for hope, peace, and truth. In the Jesus Movement, which started earnestly on the west coast and spread throughout America, millions gave their hearts and lives to Jesus.

So, given what we've seen in the first few months of 2023: Americans all over the nation prayed for Damar Hamlin's survival and recovery, the Asbury Revival, and the Jesus Revolution movie, which has earned over \$40 million at the domestic office box so far, we could be in a new Great Awakening.
