Happenings on the Way to Heaven

God and Economics

I am continuing my series on economic principles taught in the Bible.

One of the most important commandments is "Thou shalt not steal." While its importance is self-evident and something we are quick to instruct little children, there's a deeper thought behind the commandment that is foundational to Judeo-Christian society. The premise of this commandment is that property ownership is a good and necessary thing. Contrary to Nimrod, the king who built the city and tower of Babel, who wanted to control everyone and everything, God knows that individuals thrive when they are invested and rewarded personally in their work, most particularly when His people are obedient to His laws.

The Bible is full of stories about property rights. When Sarah dies, the Hittites offer to give Abraham a tomb to bury his wife. "Bury your dead in the choicest of our tombs. None of us will refuse you his tomb for burying your dead (Genesis 23:5). But Abraham insists on paying for it. He wants to own it free and clear; further, he requests witnesses to attest he holds the title. If Abraham accepted the first offer of a "free tomb" he had no protection if later in the future, others made a claim and took the area back. Without ownership, he had no right to use this plot of land even for himself.

Further, when you own something or have "dominion," you are responsible. As I wrote last month, dominion includes the notion of stewardship. It is under your control and it's expected that you will take care of it. This is why we have developed the concept of property rights. Property is under your control and it's your responsibility. If someone takes it from you unlawfully, then you have lost control. Furthermore, theft not only harms the owner. It harms the orderliness and confidence of the community.

Socialists (aka Communists, globalists, collectivists, totalitarians) are opposed to the Ten Commandments, in general, and the Thou-Shalt-Not-Steal one, in particular. They need the assets from one group so they can give them to others. They do this by fooling us into believing that we are entitled to housing, higher education, healthcare, and food, regardless of whether we earn it or not. This is not biblical nor realistic because the only way that people can have these things without working for them is if they have assistance from those people that do. When people are given things freely, it is charity, and God commands us to do this, but when a government seizes from one to give to another, it is force and theft. It is not charity.

The basis of American society has been the notion that people can work, earn, and keep the fruits of their labor to buy property. Land is not the only form of property. However important land is. There are three types of property. The first property right you possess are your thoughts. You have a right of conscience.

The second property right you possess is your labor. Your ability to work and make something or provide a service is a form of property. The third property right is your stuff. You worked and earned to acquire what you have.

The Bible is full of examples and stories that protect all three aspects of your property rights: your right of conscience, your labor, and your stuff. Our Constitution protects the rights of conscience, speech, property rights, and patents. That is one of the most important reasons that people come here is for the opportunity and respect for property rights.

So, think about the "socialists/collectivists." What do they want to do? They want to own our assets; destroy our family, control our ability to work; and control even our thoughts. Artificial Intelligence is predicted to eliminate hundreds of thousands of jobs, so the collectivists want to offer universal basic income to pacify people thereby hoping to prevent them from rioting in the street. They want to control the internet and your sources of information. They want to control your children's education; they want to centralize and control healthcare. This is not Biblical. This is the return of Nimrod, and the brick tower of Babel.

Appreciate what God made and has given to your care. Uphold and build upon God's principles. Final thoughts: Work is good. Property rights are part of God's plan of stewardship. Don't let the Collectivists fool you.
