Get Closer to God in This New Year

Every New Year's Eve, people make resolutions, such as losing weight, stopping smoking or vaping, spending more time with family, or keeping the house clean. All those things are good, but one never hears someone say they want to get closer to God by reading the Bible, praying, meditating, and listening to the Holy Spirit speak to them. Many Christians push our heavenly Father aside because we're busy and only attend church on Sundays. However, He desires to have close personal relationships with all of us.

Here are four ways to get closer to God:

- 1. Make the Lord your first priority: It says in Proverbs 3:6, "In everything you do, put God first, and he will direct you and crown your efforts with success." Every morning, dedicate ten minutes for reading and meditating on a Bible passage. Pray for guidance and purpose to glorify your heavenly Father that day. Also, by putting Him first and having a stronger relationship with Him, you'll get closer with your family and friends because you'll emulate Christ by being patient, understanding, and kind.
- 2. Join a Bible study: 2 Timothy 3:16-16 states, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." Join a Bible study either at your church or a Christian group in your community. This way, you can discuss what you read with other believers and help each other understand the meaning. Being in a Bible study will draw you nearer to God and one another as the body of Christ.
- 3. Keep a blessing journal: Write either in an actual book or on a laptop and record every blessing the Lord sends you and prayer He answers throughout the year. By writing down these things, you'll be more aware of how God works in your life and feel Him walking with you. Jesus said in Matthew 21:22, "And whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive, if you have faith."
- 4. Seek to serve and invest in others: Our Savior set for us the model of servanthood. When He shocked the disciples by washing their feet before what would be the last supper, Jesus said in John 13:15, "For I have given you an example that you also should do just as I have done to you." In Matthew 20:28, He said, "Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Happenings on the Way to Heaven by Kathryn van der Pol

What the Bible teaches us about Economic Principles, Part II

In last month's column, I discussed the Bible's teaching on the value of work. The bottom line was that meaningful work was necessary for men and women to feel productive and useful. God designed us in this way.

In Genesis 1:28, it says, "Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth." Our Lord gave us "dominion" over the earth and everything in it. Notice that God did not say that he gave dominion to rulers or to national governments or to political parties. He gave dominion or stewardship specifically to men and women alike (Genesis 2:27).

And that is what I want to write about today.

The word "steward" adds insight to what God meant by dominion. Steward's original definition means to guard, to protect, and to preserve. So, God wasn't giving ownership. He was putting human beings in charge (dominion) to care (stewardship) for what he created. He expects us to use our talents and abilities in a way that brings honor and glory to Him. He demands our faithfulness and obedience in exchange for the gift of stewardship. Think of the parable of the talents (Matthew 25) and how the Master punished the man who did nothing with what he was given, but richly rewarded those who invested with what they had been entrusted.

Stewarding earthly possessions involves a process of discovery. Since to take care of plants, animals, and people, i.e., every living thing, this requires us to develop skills and knowledge to help others as well as ourselves. We are born to become entrepreneurs, explorers, farmers, ranchers, adventurers, and creators. Gathering more skills, abilities, and wisdom from our experience will help us to serve more people and perform better work. Our labor and personal development becomes in one sense our primary or capital investment.

This is so different from the way that "collectivists" think about individuals. In my last column, I compared the biblical view to the "collectivist" view. Collectivists known as totalitarians, socialists, authoritarians, globalists, communists, and fascists share one common belief: the government is in total control of the population and believes it can replace God. People are tools of the state.

Think back to Ninevah in the Old Testament when Nimrod's people built the palace and tower of Babel. They wanted a great central city that dominated the realm and a tower that touched the heavens.. When the tower got to a certain height, God came and looked. He then destroyed it, scattered the people, and confused their language. Why? Because Nimrod believed he could replace God and take charge. God's action revealed this was faulty thinking on Nimrod's part. He, like all of us, needed to humble himself before God and realize that whatever success he enjoyed was due to God's grace and not purely his own efforts. The fact that the tower was made of bricks, that is, manmade, increased Nimrod's folly. He turned men into slaves and dehumanized them to build his tower to heaven and "city of greatness."

When we see a stone made building, we should pause and acknowledge God's hand in its creation. We should always endeavor to find ways to acknowledge Him in our work and in our projects. We are stewards.
